THE CURATOR'S CORNER with **DAN BRUCE** FRIENDS OF FINTRY MANOR HOUSE CURATOR

The curtains in Mrs. Dun-Waters' sitting room are made of new fabric, but the floral pattern was created in 1924.

John Sylvester Wheelwright was born in England in 1885. He attended Berkhampstead Public School, where he won several prizes for art. He continued this aspect of his education, making good use of the study collections at the South Kensington Museum, now better known as the "Victoria and Albert Museum". In 1920 he was appointed Chief Designer and Art Advisor at the firm of Sandersons Fabrics and Wallpapers and continued to produce designs for both products from the early 1920's to the mid 1950's. He died, aged 76 in 1962. His designs are still in production, with both wallpapers and fabrics being available today. In 1992, the Kelowna Museum held a special exhibition of his original design paintings which at that time were the property of his direct descendants then living in West Kelowna. While working on that exhibition, I recognized a design from a bedspread I had as a child... I never imagined that one day I would handle the original painting!

When work began on re-furnishing the Manor House at Fintry, I approached the Wheelwright family with the suggestion that part of a roll of new fabric that they had might be donated and used to make the curtains in the small sitting room. The idea was taken up with enthusiasm, as the roll was of the "Nasturtiums " designed and first produced in 1924, the year that the Fintry Manor burned, and was re-built.



The late Mrs. Hazel Bruce agreed to undertake the project in 2003. That was the year of the Okanagan Mountain fire. The home here in Lake Country was the temporary refuge of about fifteen small cages with people's pets that had been evacuated. These took up floor space which made laying out of curtain fabric challenging. The Indian tortoise was not accustomed to being in any enclosure, so had the free ' run' of the lower floor, an added hazard. Being a British household, the term used for these items would normally have been ' curtains' and not ' drapes'
